### **Music City Star resumes regular service this afternoon**

**NASHVILLE** – This afternoon, commuter train service on the Music City Star will resume its normal schedule after flooding from last night's storms caused morning rail service to be suspended.

Railroad tracks in Wilson County near Cairo Bend Road were deemed impassable by train staff early this morning, and service was cancelled to ensure customer safety.

Train passengers who took transit into downtown this morning can depart on the Star from Riverfront Station as normal. Train engineers will proceed with caution along the route which may result in minor delays, but service is not expected to be significantly affected.

Should this afternoon's weather produce unanticipated flooding conditions, bus service will be available for passengers to commute back to their vehicles at the Donelson and Hermitage Stations. Details for those arrangements will be released on WeGo and RTA's social media channels, should the situation deem it necessary.

Updates for passengers will be provided by RTA Staff at Riverfront Station, as well as via Facebook and Twitter.
